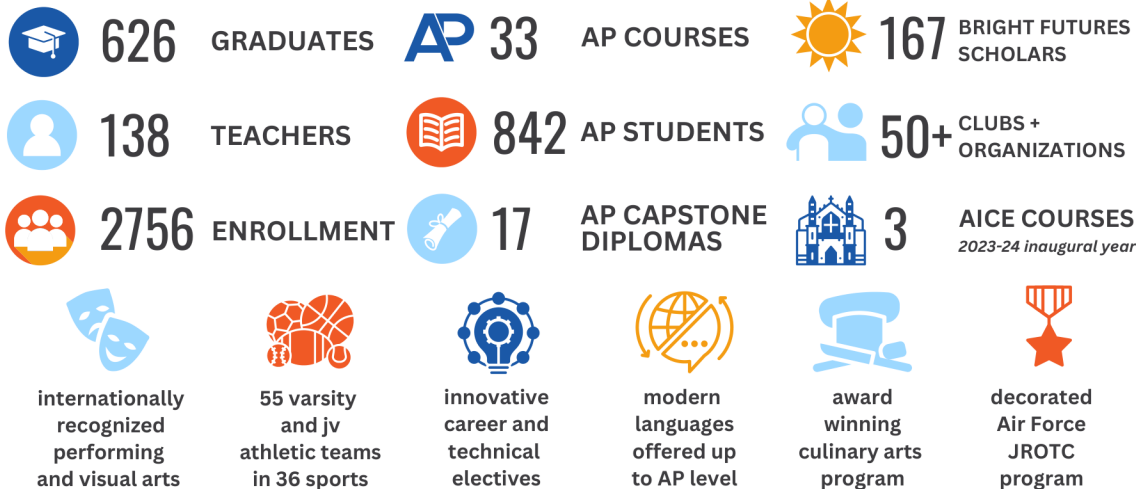

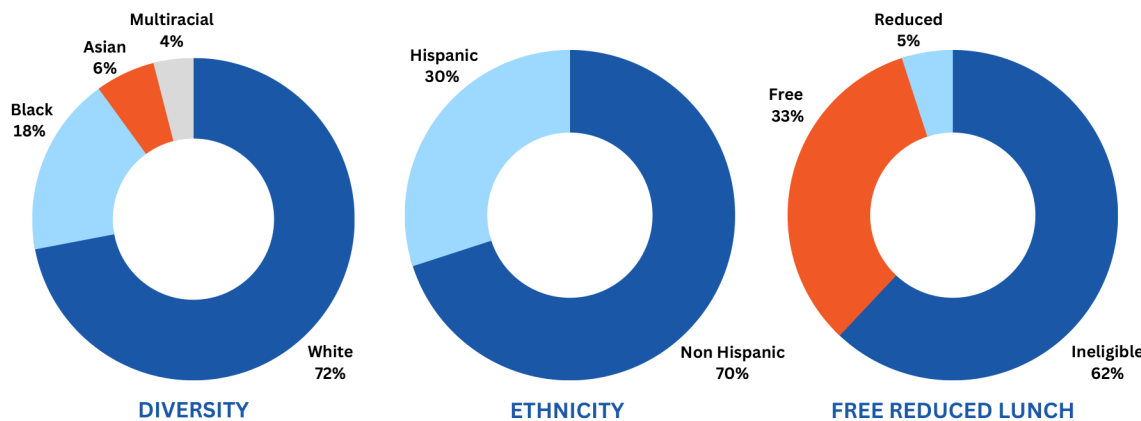
school profile

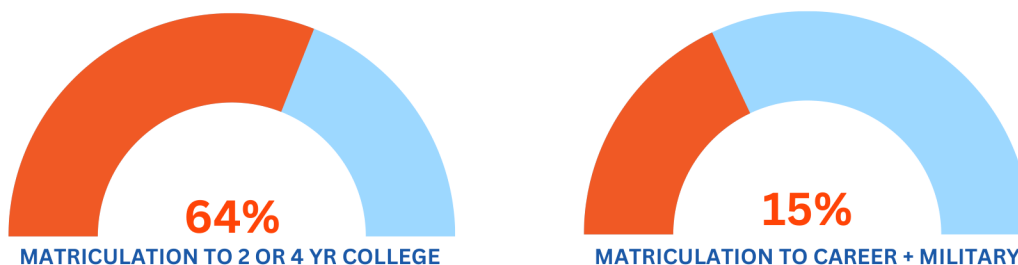
SCHOOL ENVIRONMENT (FY 2022-23)

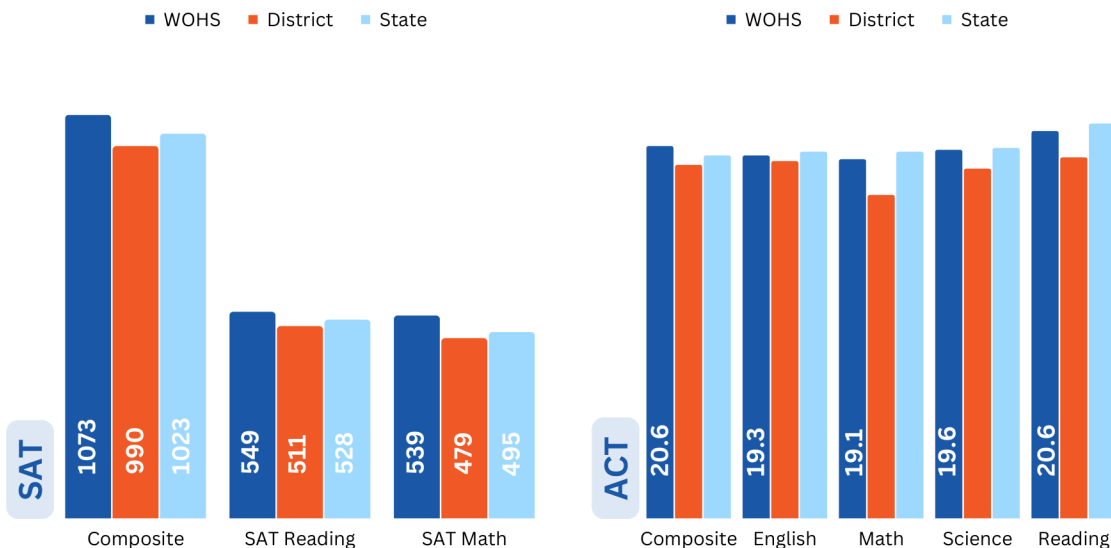

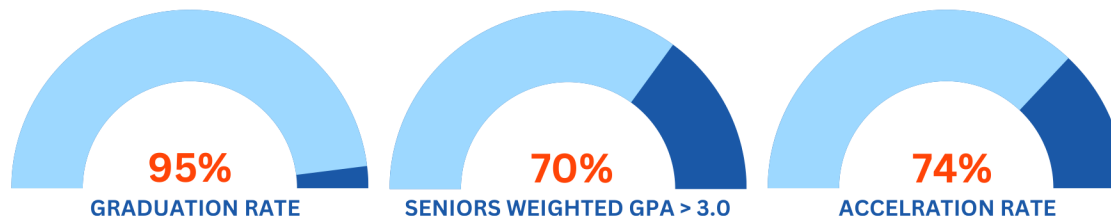

GRADE FORGIVENESS
